



SCRIPT eLearning Supporting Prescribing and Therapeutics Teaching: <u>Preparation for the Prescribing Safety Assessment</u>

The <u>Prescribing Safety Assessment</u> (PSA) is an online assessment allowing candidates to demonstrate competency in relation to the safe and effective use of medicines. The assessment is taken by medical students in their clinical years (i.e., Year 4 and 5). All Foundation Year 1 doctors (including overseas graduates) must have passed the PSA to complete their Foundation Year 1 training.

SCRIPT eLearning can be used to help candidates prepare for the PSA and to support those who must re-sit the assessment. Table 1 provides a list of the SCRIPT modules that are most likely to be helpful to candidates preparing to sit the PSA.
