The Scottish National Blood Transfusion Service delivers transfusion related key training requirements to medical students within Scotland. These are delivered either by the clinical units in Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow and Inverness, or by Better Blood Transfusion.
Training activity includes providing an appropriate understanding of issues relating to safet transfusion practice, practicalities related to gaining appropriate transfusion support when required and the more specialised areas relating to transfusion medicine (where appropriate).

In addition, there are a number of specialist service modules designed to deliver a more detailed understanding of some specialised areas delivered by the Transfusion Service, e.g. delivery of transfusion support following major haemorrhage, Specialist Study Modules relating to tissue typing and transplantation.

SNBTS is a division of NSS which operates as an independent NHS Board. Transfusion related training is delivered by the Scottish National Blood Transfusion Service to medical students in Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow and Inverness. Student evaluation of the modules delivered is performed at a local level. Additional feedback may also be provided from the various medical schools where the transfusion training has formed part of a Specialist Study Module. This information is reviewed at each site and the training modules are reviewed and modified accordingly.

It is anticipated that SNBTS will continue to provide a similar level of activity in relation to delivery of transfusion medicine training to the medical students in Scotland.
