GP Fellowships 2024

- **Medical Education Fellowships** **4 posts (5 sessions a week)**
- **Health Inequality Fellowships** **4 posts (5 sessions a week)**
- **GP Rural Fellowships** **10 full time posts**

Medical Education Fellowship

Aim

- To develop a cadre of educational leaders within General Practice
- To develop specific skills related to Medical Education.

3 components

- **Local Educational component** – Fellows participate in local educational delivery which may also include quality assurance
- **Academic component** – fellows to commence a postgraduate qualification relevant to medical education for example a certificate in medical education
- **Project work**

No clinical component to this role. Fellows need to organise additional clinical work to maintain their GP skills .

Health Inequality Fellowship

Aim

- To develop existing GP skills
- To develop specific skills related to Health Inequality which are relevant to the health needs of Scotland.

3 components

- **Clinical component** – 2 sessions in a clinical setting linked to deprivation
- **Academic component** - this could consist of modules related to inequalities in health and healthcare. The University of Glasgow Masters of Primary Care would be an appropriate source.
- **Project** –the Fellow will undertake a project related to Health Inequalities in the community

Rural Fellowship

Slightly different , a collaboration between NES and Health Boards

1. To promote Rural GP as a distinct career choice
2. To help GPs to acquire the knowledge and skills required for rural general practice
3. To help those GPs who wish to develop skills to provide acute care in remote hospitals
4. To provide the opportunity for GPs to experience rural community living.

Rural Fellowship

3 Types of Rural Fellowships

- **Standard** – based in primary care
- **Acute** – focus on developing skills as Rural Practitioners in Rural Acute Care settings such as Small District General or Rural hospitals.
- **Hybrid** – based in GP with a significant amount of Community Hospital/Minor injury unit involvement

Rural Fellowship

- **12-month contract with a Rural Health Board**
- **A wide range of locations throughout Scotland**
- **50% Educational component**
 - Base practice **with a GP mentor** . 25% total time working here.
 - approx. 11 weeks for personal development
 - Courses – e.g. BASICS ,SCOTTIE
 - Clinical attachments (both in hospital and in primary care)
 - Study
 - 3 x fellow meetings
- **50% service commitment-** supporting Rural Health Boards
 - Working in rural practices – eg locum cover to remote practices.
 - Rural OOH services
- **The Fellow is expected to do a project on a rural topic of their choice.**

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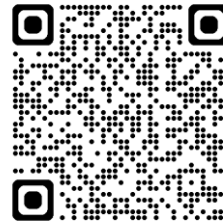
