



Part One course registration now open

RCGP Scotland's <u>Certificate in the Management of Problem Drug Use</u> is a two-part course designed to assist primary care professionals help and care for people affected by drug use. The course adopts a holistic approach to helping people who use drugs, their families and communities, including new priorities and changes in management and treatment. The ethos of this training is to promote reducing harm and drug deaths within a recovery focused framework.

Part One is open to people working at a generalist level and those intending to provide treatment as part of a locally or nationally enhanced service and consists of **two short e-modules** provided by Scottish Drugs Forum and either **one full day in person OR two half-day online sessions.**
