Programme details

Decision making & consent

Shared decision making and consent are fundamental to good medical practice. The GMC's new guidance explains that the exchange of information between doctor and patient is essential to good decision making. Serious harm can result if patients are not listened to, or if they are not given the information they need - and time and support to understand it - so they can make informed decisions about their care.

This interactive session will explore how the guidance will support you in your conversations with your patients; and help you to be confident you're sharing the information they need to make decisions that are right for them. Knowing how to use the guidance will help you make sure that you have informed consent from your patient.

The session will cover:

- What you should tell a patient when talking about risks
- What to do if your patient doesn't want to hear information you think is relevant
- What to do if your patient may lack capacity to make a decision
- What you should record
